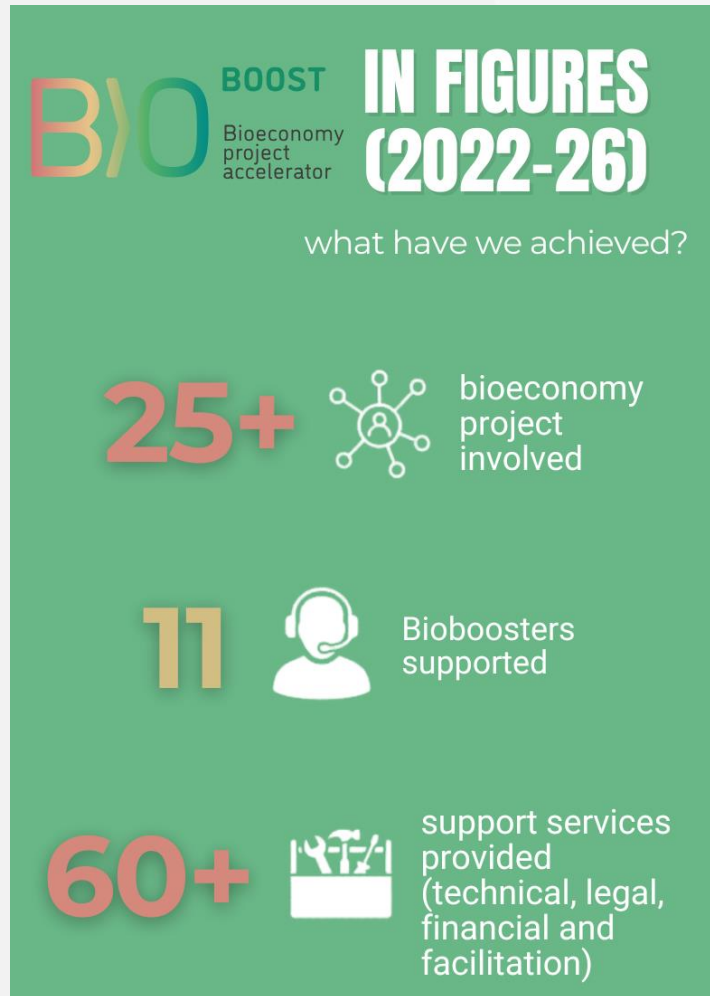

4 YEARS ACCELERATING THE BIOECONOMY IN CATALONIA

After four years of work, the Bioboost project is reaching its final stage with a clear goal: to turn the potential of the bioeconomy into real, viable and investable projects.

Throughout the project, we have worked alongside project promoters, public authorities and investors to reduce barriers, maximise project impact and facilitate their implementation.

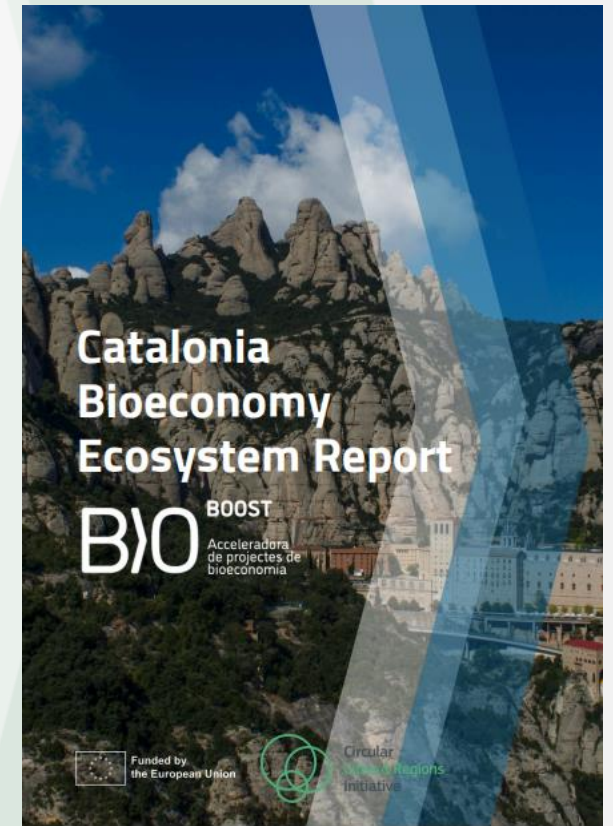
RESOURCES GENERATED DURING THE PROJECT

CONNECTING WITH THE ECOSYSTEM

In recent months, Bioboost has continued to take part in key bioeconomy ecosystem events:



BIT Congress (Vic, Spain)

A space where the sector's main challenge was addressed: how to move from pilot projects to full-scale implementation, aligning regulation, investment and territory.



Technical workshop at Leitat (Terrassa, Spain)

A session focused on innovative circular bioeconomy solutions applied to the agri-food sector, highlighting the importance of connecting technology with real-world application.

POLICY ENGAGEMENT

Bioboost has also contributed to the public consultation on the draft bill for the **simplification of procedures in the urban planning and environmental fields**, promoted by the Government of Catalonia.

Based on our direct experience with projects, we emphasised the need to:

- simplify and streamline procedures
- improve coordination between public administrations
- ensure a clearer and more predictable regulatory framework

This is particularly relevant for bioeconomy projects with controlled environmental impact.
